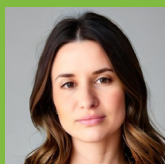


### Marion Desmarchelier

A graduate of the Veterinary School of Lyon, France, Dr. Marion Desmarchelier started her career in mixed practice in the Alps. She moved to Canada to perform an internship, and then a residency in zoological medicine in Québec. She has been teaching several years in Zoo, Exotic and Wild Animal Medicine at the Atlantic Veterinary College of Prince Edward Island before returning to the Université de Montréal to pursue an animal behavior medicine residency program in parallel to working as a clinical instructor in zoological medicine. She is a diplomate of the American College of Zoological Medicine, of the European College of Zoological Medicine (Zoo Health Management), and of the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists. Dr. Desmarchelier is currently an Associate Professor in behaviour medicine at the Faculté de médecine vétérinaire of the Université de Montréal in Québec and also provides telemedicine consultations for exotic pets through her own company Night Owl Veterinary Specialists.
